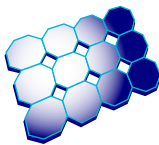

Update on 2011 Legislation

The following 2011 legislation pertains to health facilities issues:

AB 30 Hayashi (D-Hayward)

Expands security plan reporting and personnel training relative to security. Increases interviewing of employees regarding an incident. Requires medical staff training on the security plan. Some AB 30 requirements conflict with workers' compensation requirements.

CHA Opposes

Status: On Assembly Appropriations suspense file due to costs encountered by the state.

AB 762 Smyth (R-Santa Clarita)

Medical waste bill that allows sharps and non-RNRA pharmaceuticals to be comingled as long as they are treated by incineration or another high heat technology.

CHA Sponsored

Status: Went through the Assembly on consent. Moves to the Senate.

SB 90 Steinberg (D-Sacramento)

Allows hospitals to receive an extension up to 2020 under prescribed conditions. SB 90 does not go into effect until SB 335 Hernandez (D-Los Angeles) is enacted and the federal government approves a match for the 2012 hospital fee program. Since this may not occur until early 2012, OSHPD is developing SB 90 emergency regulations and will place them in a Policy Intent Notice so hospitals can start working on an SB 90 extension by September, 2011.

CHA Supported

Status: Enacted into law.

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SB 630 Alquist (D-Santa Clara)

A hospital seismic safety bill which is identical to SB 289 which was introduced in 2010 and vetoed by the Governor. The key components of SB 630 are addressed in SB 90. Therefore, SB 630 has become a two-year bill and will not be heard during 2011.

AB 510 Lowenthal (D-Long Beach)

This is a CHA-sponsored spot bill for seismic safety. Due to SB 90 being enacted, AB 510 has become a 2-year bill.

ASHE Certified Healthcare for Facility Managers (CHFM)



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- A renewal requirement. Certification is valid for three years at which time it must be renewed through retaking and passing the Certification Examination or documenting 45 contact hours of continuing professional education.

At the ASHE 48th Annual Conference, July 17-20 in Seattle, the CHFM exam will be offered on Wednesday,

July 20. If you are unable to attend the ASHE Conference, the test can be taken at participating H&R Block offices. As a benefit to CSHE members, we offer five one hour conference call review sessions prior to the conference. The weekly CHFM review calls will commence the week of June 13 and conclude the week of July 11. Each weekly session will concentrate on a section of the exam:

- Maintenance and Operations
- Code Compliance
- Planning, Design and Construction
- Finance Management
- Administration

The cost to participate on the calls is \$50 per line for the five calls. If you are interested in participating on the CHFM review conference calls, please contact the CSHE office to register at (916) 552-7639 or email jjones@calhospital.org. Checks can be made to CSHE,
